The Department of Psychology at the Pontificia Universidad Católica del Perú (PUCP) is hiring for 01 tenure track faculty position.

One (1) tenure track faculty position

The Department seeks early career professionals in Psychology who hold a PhD or PsyD in Psychology and have extensive research experience. The successful candidate should be interested in a tenure position and be committed to the Department of Psychology's vision and mission.

This full-time position involves 40 hours per week. Responsibilities include 10 hours of teaching and 30 hours dedicated to research, student mentoring, thesis supervision, teaching preparation and preparation of materials. An active participation in the department work groups and other activities commissioned by the Department is expected.

REQUIREMENTS

- a. A PhD or PsyD in Psychology and a Bachelor's degree in Psychology
- b. 2 publications indexed in Scopus or Web of Science
- c. At least 2 years of teaching experience
- d. Experience in collaborative working groups
- e. 2 paper presentations or more at international conferences
- f. Experience in the design and implementation of at least 2 projects with external funding
- g. Additional peer-reviewed academic publications, such as book chapters or books, are preferred.

COMMITMENTS AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE SELECTED APPLICANT

a. Research commitments

- i. Author at least two academic publications indexed in Scopus or Web of Science.
- ii. Present at least two paper presentations at an international peer-reviewed conference to support the visibility of the research done at PUCP.
- iii. Formulate and participate in at least one project with external funding.
- iv. Participate in the department's research labs or creation of a research lab or network on the subject of their expertise

b. Teaching Commitments

- Teach 10 hours per week each academic year. Minimum 6 hours in undergraduate studies in Psychology or General Studies, and the rest in graduate school
- ii. Advise at least 2 new BA thesis per semester (regardless of the number of graduate theses being advised).
- iii. Demonstrate high performance on the Teacher Opinion Survey, reaching a minimum of 85 points according to the PUCP standards.
- iv. Participate in continued education to hone teaching skills, either through free courses offered by PUCP or others.

c. PUCP affiliation

PUCP affiliation is mandatory in all publications and presentations at academic events.

d. Exclusiveness

During the assignment period, teaching exclusively at PUCP is mandatory. The candidate will be able to teach or do research in other educational institutions (or equivalent) only as a visiting professor or researcher.

e. Commitment to the department

The successful candidate is expected to participate in academic-administrative tasks in the department and to contribute to its internationalization. The candidate must attend monthly faculty meetings and other department meetings.

A two-page document in A4 format, addressed to the Head of Department, that includes:

- Academic history
- Current working position and name of the institution
- Main professional and academic achievements
- Interest in the position and motivations for application
- Expectations if hired by the university
- Potential plan as a PUCP professor
- Expected contributions to Peruvian psychology or Peruvian society
- d. Research statement
 - Interest in research
 - Abilities for research
 - Topics or lines of research
 - Research summary, highlighting the most important experiences
 - International conferences
 - Current and future research, and funding to achieve them
 - Up-to-date list of publications in descending order
- e. Most representative published paper on the research line of interest
- f. Teaching statement, a two-page document in A4 format stating:
 - Personal appreciation of the teaching practice in this discipline
 - University teaching experiences
 - Detailed description of teaching philosophy and approach
 - Strengths and areas of growth regarding university teaching
 - Preferred courses and topics
- g. Two letters of recommendation related to research, signed by researchers or university professors

EVALUATION PROCESS

A 5-member Evaluation Committee will be organized (3 PUCP members and 2 non-members). Applicants will be evaluated in the following areas: (a) teaching, (b) research and publications,(c) institutional identity, and expected future at PUCP.

Additionally, the evaluation will be done in three stages:

- Review of documents: CV, letter of introduction, statements on research and teaching, among others.
- Proficiency on teaching and research, involving an interview via Zoom and a sample class, seminar or conference session.
- The PUCP required psychological assessment will provide information about the applicant's profile.
 This information will be reviewed by specialists and will not be considered a part of the evaluation score.
